
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ACTIVITY LEVEL REQUIREMENTS – IMPORTANT

Please note that the jungle safari involves traveling on very bumpy roads, which may not be suitable for guests with back issues. If you have mild mobility limitations but feel confident in your ability to participate, we kindly ask that you travel with a companion who can assist you as needed as our team will not be able to. JUNGLE JEEP SAFARI


Discover the wild beauty of Chitwan National Park, Nepal's iconic UNESCO World Heritage site, on an unforgettable half-day jeep safari through the heart of Chitwan National Park, Nepal's premier wildlife reserve.

You'll travel into the park aboard an open-top jeep, guided by an experienced naturalist who will help you spot and identify the park's incredible wildlife. As you explore a variety of landscapes—dense forests, open grasslands, and serene riverbanks—you'll have the chance to encounter one-horned rhinoceroses, deer, monkeys, wild boars, and a stunning variety of birds. With a bit of luck, you may even catch a glimpse of the elusive Bengal tiger. This safari offers an unforgettable opportunity to experience Nepal's first national park and its remarkable biodiversity in just a few hours.

CANOE RIDE DOWN THE RAPTI RIVER

Gliding down the Rapti River in a traditional dugout canoe offers a peaceful yet captivating way to explore the rich ecosystem of Chitwan National Park. As you float gently along the calm waters, you'll have the chance to observe marsh mugger crocodiles and the endangered gharial sunning themselves on the riverbanks—from a safe and respectful distance. This tranquil journey also provides an excellent vantage point for birdwatching, with kingfishers, herons, storks, and countless other species often seen along the water's edge. It's a uniquely serene experience that allows you to connect with nature while witnessing wildlife in its most undisturbed and natural setting.

After your serene canoe journey along the Rapti River, unwind with a sundowner on the riverbank, where you can relax and take in the stunning views as the sun sets over the jungle—an unforgettable way to end the day in Chitwan.



JUNGLE NATURE WALK

Jungle walks in Chitwan National Park offer an immersive and intimate way to experience the park's diverse ecosystems, ranging from floodplain grasslands and riverine forests to the dense and ancient Sal tree groves. Led by experienced naturalist guides, these walks provide a rare opportunity to observe wildlife quietly and respectfully, minimizing disturbance and increasing your chances of encountering animals in their natural habitat. You may spot a wide array of bird life and species, including deer, monkeys, wild boars, and—with luck—even endangered animals like the one-horned rhinoceros or sloth bear. Along the way, your guide will share fascinating insights into the park's rich flora, including medicinal plants, herbs, and the vital role each species plays in this thriving ecosystem. It's a meaningful and enriching experience for those who want to deepen their connection with nature and explore the jungle in its purest form, on foot.

THARU CULTURAL WALK

The Tharu are the indigenous people of the Chitwan region. This experience offers a meaningful opportunity to learn about their rich culture and traditions. You'll explore village life and traditional homes, and visit the community-run museum, accompanied by a local guide and translator.

CULTURAL EVENING PROGRAM

We'll be warmly welcomed by the Tharu and Kumal people, two of the indigenous communities of the Chitwan region, who will share their rich heritage through captivating cultural dances, traditional music, and colorful attire. Their performances offer not only vibrant entertainment but also a meaningful window into their daily life, customs, and deep-rooted connection to the land and jungle. This is a unique opportunity to engage with local traditions and gain a deeper appreciation for the cultural diversity of Nepal.


